JUDGMENT WITHOUT OPINION

When this case was called for hearing, Counsellor Raymond A. Hoggard appeared for the

appellee and called the Court's attention to a motion filed to dismiss appellant's appeal. No

one appeared for the appellant and there was no resistance filed to the motion to dismiss.
