JUDGMENT WITHOUT OPINION.

Decided December 14, 1978.*

When this case was called, Counsellor *Joseph J. F. Chesson* appeared for the appellant, and Counsellor *Amos George* appeared for the appellee and filed motion to dismiss the appeal on the ground that no appeal was announced in court when the final judgment was rendered on March 25, 1975, as is required by law where a losing party intends to appeal on adverse judgment; and also on the ground that the notice of completion of appeal was served and returned by the sheriff eleven days beyond the statutory time allowed for the taking of this jurisdictional step. After studying the motion and the resistance, and after having heard arguments on both sides, it is adjudged that the motion should be and the same is hereby granted and the appeal is dismissed with costs against the appellant. And the Clerk of this Court is ordered to send a mandate down to the court below commanding the judge presiding therein to resume jurisdiction and enforce the judgment. And it is so ordered.
