JUDGMENT WITHOUT OPINION

When this case was called, no one appeared for the appellee and Counsellor S. B. Dunbar appeared for the appellant and called the Court's attention to his motion filed to withdraw his appeal. He further informed the Court that a copy of said motion was served on one of counsel for appellee in person of Counsellor Abraham B.
