JUDGMENT WITHOUT OPINION

When this case was called, Counsellor MacDonald Krakue appeared for the appellant. Counsellor J. D. Gordon appeared for the appellee and filed motion to dismiss the appeal on the grounds that there was a defective appeal bond, and that the service of the notice of completion of the appeal was served and filed far beyond the time required by statute for such filing. After studying the motion and the resistance, and hearing arguments of counsel on both sides, it is adjudged that the motion to dismiss should be and the same is hereby granted and the appeal is dismissed with costs against the appellant. The Clerk of this Court is ordered to send a mandate to the court below commanding the judge presiding therein to resume jurisdiction over the cause and enforce the judgment. And it is so ordered.
