In re COUNSELLOR JOSEPH P. H. FINDLEY.

JUDGMENT WITHOUT OPINION.*

Decided December 13, 1974.

Growing out of a judgment suspending Counsellor Joseph P. H. Findley from the practice of law for a period of six months, for disrespect shown to a Justice of the Supreme Court, and also for insulting behavior before the Court, the suspended Counsellor filed an application for the Court to reconsider its judgment and restore him to practice.

Appropriate apologies having been written by the Counsellor and accepted by the Court; and upon a petition for reargument filed by Counsellor Findley having been withdrawn; and the Court being satisfied with the penitence shown by the said Counsellor, it is adjudged that the suspension for six months imposed on Counsellor Findley be and it is hereby lifted and he is by this judgment restored to practice in any of the courts of the Republic. The Clerk of this Court is ordered to send mandates to all courts informing them of this judgment. It is so ordered.
