JUDGMENT WITHOUT OPINION.

At the call of this case, counsellor M. Fahnbulleh Jones appeared for the appellants; counsellor Joseph Williamson appeared for the appellees. They filed a stipulation of withdrawal of the appeal signed by all parties. After considering the stipulation and in consideration of Rule III, Part 2 of the Rules of the Supreme Court (1972), it is adjudged that the stipulation withdrawing the appeal should be allowed, with costs against the appellants. And the Clerk of this Court is ordered to strike this case from the docket of the Supreme Court and inform the trial court that the parties have stipulated to withdraw the appeal and terminate all litigation pending between them pertaining to the subject matter. And it is ordered.
