No appearance for appellant. Toye C. Bernard for appellees.

When this case was called, no appearance was made for appellant. Counsellor Toye C. Bernard appeared for appellees and moved to dismiss the appeal on the ground that no appeal bond was ever filed and notice of completion of the appeal was filed 190 days after rendition of judgment, instead of the sixty days allowed by law. After studying the record and verifying the allegations contained in the motion of appellees, it is adjudged that the motion to dismiss the appeal should be and the same is hereby granted and the appeal is dismissed. The Clerk of this Court is ordered to send a mandate to the trial court, commanding the judge therein to resume jurisdiction and enforce the judgment with costs against the appellant. It is so ordered.
